13 as or like. The two words are often interchanged like hockey sticks, and many mistaken transferences of role occur. In general, as should be used before adverbs (there are times, as now, when I could hate him) and prepositions (he acted well again, as in 'Henry V' last year). Like should be used before nouns, noun phrases, and pronouns, and occasionally as a conjunction. Sometimes the choice between the two words affects the meaning: let me discuss this with you as your father is obviously not the same as let me discuss this with you like your father.
