## Although / though / even though In spite of / despite

A

Study this example situation:



Last year Paul and Sarah had a holiday by the sea. It rained a lot, but they enjoyed it.

You can say:

Although it rained a lot, they enjoyed it.

(= It rained a lot, but they ...)

or

In spite of Despite the rain, they enjoyed it.

В	After although we use a subject + verb:  Although it rained a lot, we enjoyed our holiday.  I didn't get the job although I had the necessary qualifications.
	Compare the meaning of although and because:  We went out although it was raining heavily.  We didn't go out because it was raining heavily.
C	After in spite of or despite, we use a noun, a pronoun (this/that/what etc.) or -ing:  In spite of the rain, we enjoyed our holiday.  I didn't get the job in spite of having the necessary qualifications.  She wasn't well, but in spite of this she continued working.  In spite of what I said yesterday, I still love you.
3	<ul><li>Despite is the same as in spite of. We say in spite of, but despite (without of):</li><li>She wasn't well, but despite this she continued working. (not despite of this)</li></ul>
3	You can say in spite of the fact (that) and despite the fact (that) :  I didn't get the job { in spite of the fact (that) } I had the necessary qualifications.
	Compare in spite of and because of:  We went out in spite of the rain. (or despite the rain.)  We didn't go out because of the rain.
D	Compare although and in spite of / despite:  Although the traffic was bad,   we arrived on time. (not In spite of the traffic was bad)
	<ul> <li>I couldn't sleep { although I was very tired. (not despite I was tired) despite being very tired.</li> </ul>
E	Though is the same as although:  I didn't get the job though I had the necessary qualifications.
	In spoken English we often use <b>though</b> at the end of a sentence:  The house isn't so nice. I like the garden <b>though</b> . (= but I like the garden)  I see them every day. I've never spoken to them <b>though</b> . (= but I've never spoken to them)
	Even though (but not 'even' alone) is a stronger form of although:  Even though I was really tired, I couldn't sleep. (not Even I was really tired)
